Summer Food Service Program

What is the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP)?

SFSP is a program sponsored by Southwest Human Resource Agency that allows children to receive yummy, nutritious meals throughout the community free of charge.



How does it work?

Southwest Human Resources teams up with the sites where food is offered to create and distribute meals Monday - Friday during the summer months. Site operators are pre-approved and trained to handle the food properly and safely. The food given to children is similar to meals eaten at school, and meals can be served at breakfast, lunch, or supper. Snacks may also be served at some locations.



Where can my child receive meals?

Distribution sites are scattered across Hardin County and may change each year. For an updated list of locations and serving dates and times at each location, see the link labeled "SFSP Hardin County Sites."

Is my child eligible to receive food at the distribution locations?

Yes! Anyone 18 and under, regardless of race, sex, or income, may receive meals at our sites.
